### 1. INTRODUCTION

The introduction should state the subject of the article in a language understandable to a non-specialist, briefly highlight the history of the issue, and justify the place of the author's original research among other studies.

In the text of the article, references to literary sources are indicated strictly in the order of citation in square brackets: [1], [2, 3], [4–6].

Page format: **A4**, top and left margins: **2.5** cm, right and bottom: **1.5** cm. Font size: **12** points, line spacing: **1.5** spacing.

### 2. SECTION NUMBERING, FORMULAS AND NUMBERS

#### *2.1. Section Numbering*

The section number and title is typed in capital letters and located in the center of the line. The subsections title is typed in italic with capital first letters of words.

#### *2.2. Formulas*

Decimal digits in the text and figures are typed only through a period: 0.5

$$-1 \leq v \leq 0.5 \quad (2.1)$$

Formulas are numbered according to sections: (1.1), (1.2), (2.1), (2.2) etc., where the first number indicates the number of the section, and the second is the ordinal number in this section.

Vectors and matrices are typed in bold upright type (the arrow above the vector is not used).

Numbers, Greek letters and functions, such as  $\sin 2x$ ,  $\cos \omega t$ , etc., are typed in roman type.

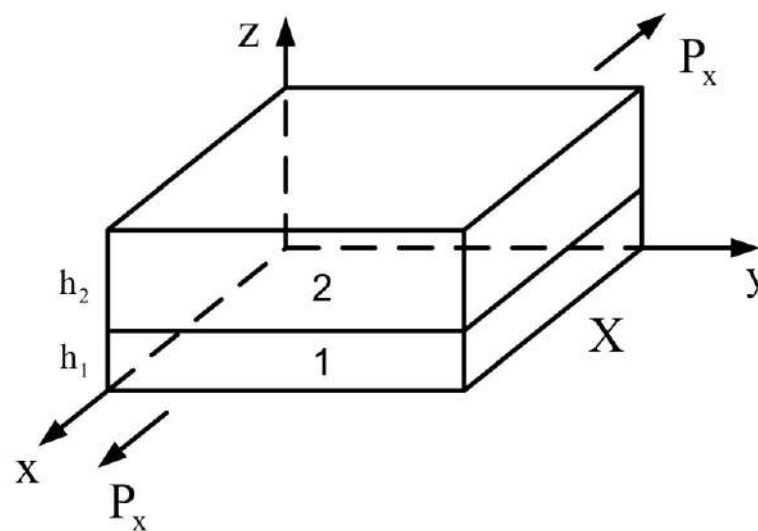

Formulas are recommended to be typed in Equation Editor or MathType.

Aligning formulas is recommended using tabs (8.5 cm is centered for the formula itself, 17 cm is right-aligned for the number).

### 4. FIGURES

1. On the axes, do not indicate the dimension of the quantities, indicate in the text of the article.
2. In the figure, inscriptions in the Latin alphabet are prohibited. Replace them with numbers that are explained in the text of the article.
3. Figures are created strictly by computer means. Scanned copies of drawings made by hand are not allowed.
4. Figures prepared in commonly used graphics packages (CorelDraw, Adobe Illustrator, FreeHand, etc.) can be submitted in their native format or in encapsulated postscript (EPS) format. The recommended width of a graph is not more than 15–17 cm. The JPEG format is allowed only for photographs. For graphs, the vector formats EPS, WMF, EMF, and raster formats TIFF, BMP, and PNG with not less than **300dpi** are recommended.

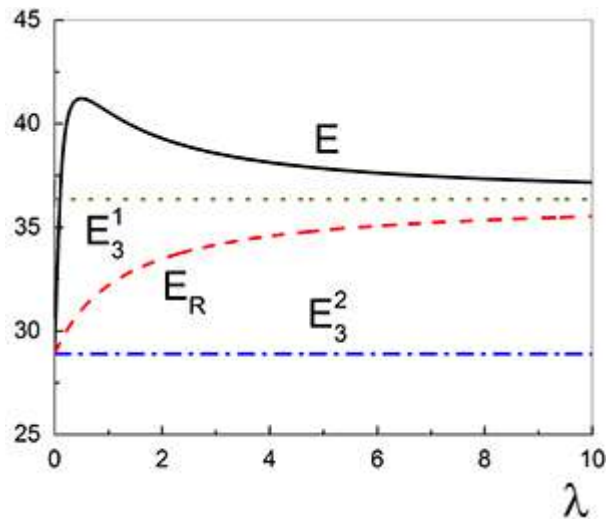


Fig.2. Caption

5. If you plan to present color images, use different line styles (see Fig.2). Attention. The printed version of the journal is black and white.

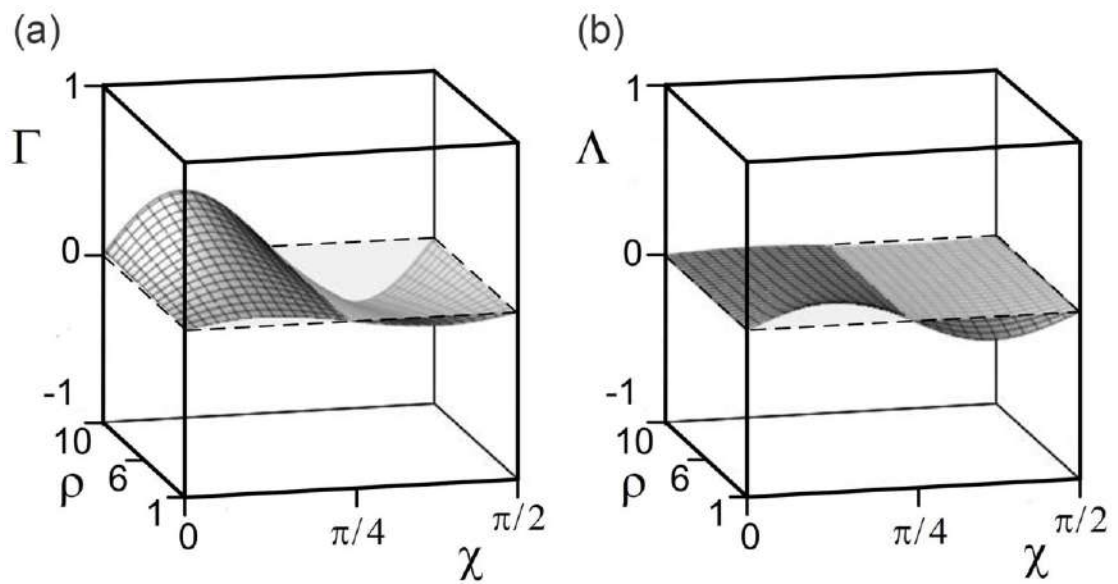


Fig.3. Caption
